Keeping A Sketch Journal

Have you ever wondered where life was GOING in such a hurry? Do the months and days and hours fly by in a rush and you can't remember what you did yesterday, let alone last month? Well, as an artist there is a lovely way to slow that rush, and to celebrate the things in our lives, both large and small. You can keep a sketch journal.




Similar in concept to a diary, a sketch journal can contain drawings, sketches and even paintings, but also words-snippets of notes, observations, bits of conversation. You can work through a sticky situation, and sketch out various solutions. Record that special trip, document the growth and changes in your children. Draw the birds that visit your feeder, or study the wildflowers in your local park. You can plan ahead, with visuals and written notes. Sketch the plan for next spring's garden, take minutes-and annotate them with caricatures! - at a boring meeting, even write your grocery list, right in your sketch journal.

This journal page records a trip to the desert Southwest-I used a Micron Pigma pen, and sketched the landscape along with the tiny details I found at my feet.


Work in pencil, ink, color pencil, watercolor-whatever suits the subject and your mood. Paste in photos, boarding passes, maps-whatever you like!



Art 38-2, lunch


You can even record such everyday things as a special lunch out-I'd forgotten my pen and borrowed a blue ballpoint, then added watercolor washes when I got home.

(Like what year a favorite stray cat showed up on my doorstep, or what it was like when I first saw the land my cabin is on.)
